The Title-V Program is the Senior Community Employment Program being sponsored by DFTA. The program is geared to mature workers age 55 and older and is specifically designed to allow our golden citizenry the opportunity to remain active and connected.

The Adult-Senior population may enroll in the program and receive a wage/stipend of \$7.15 per hour for a 20 hour work week, while they are in training with community assignments (partner organizations are included).

DFTA is presently recruiting. In order to be eligible you must be low income, unemployed, and interested in getting a full-time or part-time job as soon as possible.

The Senior Employment Training Program Center offers:
Computer Skills: Training includes Introduction to Computer, Microsoft Word Basics, Microsoft Excel Basics, and Internet and E-mail Basics.

Personal Care Aide: This training is four weeks and you can become a Certified Personal Care Aide (PCA). The courses are offered in English, Spanish and Chinese.

Customer Service: In this course, you will learn the necessary skills to provide professional Customer Service in different industry settings.

Dept. of Sanitation Notes from the November Meeting

IN THE EVENT YOU MISSED SOMETHING:

- ✓ Night Plow Season began Monday, November 12th
- ✓ Two sections of CB3 will have evening collection: 4:00 PM to 12:00 AM and 12:00 AM—8:00 AM
- ✓ There is no leaf recycling program in CB3.
- ✓ In Brooklyn, it is unlawful for DSNY to pick up organic wood due to Asian Long-horned beetle infestation. Call 311 for removal information.
- ✓ Effective December 26, 2007, Sanitation Enforcement Officers will be inspecting residential blocks between the hours of 8:00 AM to 9:00 AM and 6:00 PM—7:00 PM. **DON'T GET A TICKET!** Recycle and keep sidewalks clean.
- ✓ Multi-dwellings of 6 families or more and commercial buildings are required to have all graffiti removed—IT IS THE LAW. Anti-graffiti waivers give DSNY permission to remove the graffiti. A summons will be issued at \$450 per day. Call 311
- ✓ A new law has been passed regarding clothing bins. They are no longer permitted on the street. Owners will have 30 days to remove them or face a fine.
- ✓ CURB YOUR DOG. Fines have increased to \$100.
